The two programs offer films suitable for different ages and year levels.

▶ Young Audience Program

Duration: 43 mins

Films: 5 films

Suitable for young audiences, including OSHC's, Kindergarten's and primary schools.

▶ Full program

Duration: 87 mins

Films: 9 films

Suitable for students 15 years and older.
